Facility notes / comments:

This location is the secondary location under the license. This location includes a residence and a pole-shed building.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES – (Residence) Some dogs may be kept in the home and cared for in a pet-like fashion. The heated garage has designated dog enclosures that may be when necessary. These enclosures are constructed of welded-wire panels / x-pens upon a cement flooring. (Pole shed) Other dogs at this location may be kept within an unheated pole shed building. Within this building are five (5) primary enclosures. Enclosures have an indoor portion constructed of welded-wire panels upon a cement flooring/ rubber mats and an attached outdoor run constructed of welded-wire panels. Outdoor runs are covered by an overhanging roof. Each enclosure has an indoor floor area of approximately 25 ft² (dimension: 5' x 5') and an outdoor floor area of approximately 25 ft² (dimension: 5' x 5').

WHELPNG / NURSERY ENCLOSURES – Dams whelp & nurse litters within an enclosure in the heated garage of the residence. An enclosure constructed of x-pen panels is used. Cleanable flooring, a whelping box, and a litter box are provided. When puppies get older they are transitioned into a larger enclosure. This enclosure is constructed of x-pen panels upon a cleanable flooring.

EXERCISE – (Residence) Dogs are allowed to roam the yard when supervised. (Pole shed) Dogs kept within this building have access to outdoor runs through their dog doors. These runs connect to a larger exercise pen. Dogs are able to have access to this larger spaces multiple times/ day or for extended periods of time.

OUTDOOR FACILITIES - The location has a large, fenced exercise yard adjacent to the pole-shed.

- Many dogs within the licensee's dog breeding program are in guardian homes (home custody providers) within Wisconsin and neighboring states.
- In 2023 the licensee plans to renovate the pole-shed building and convert it into a designated dog housing
 area. The indoor housing area will have temperature-controls and will serve as the primary dog housing
 space for adult dogs and litters of puppies.

Inspection summary:

January 23, 2023

(10:00 am) – Colin Benell (Companion Animal Inspector, DATCP) conducted a pre-licensing inspection of the dog breeding facility and dog records at W4954 County Road O, Medford, WI. Benell was accompanied and assisted by James Stokes (Owner of property & Stokhaus Media, LLC).

Dog inventory: 7 adult/ juvenile dogs (within breeding program), 1 puppy.

Based upon the results of the pre-licensing inspection a FULL STATUS license is recommended.

Deficiencies:

ATCP 16.22 Dogs kept indoors. The following requirements apply to an indoor facility at which a person keeps dogs pursuant to a license under s. ATCP 16.02 (1):

- (7) Lighting, temperature and ventilation.
- (b) An indoor facility shall have adequate heating and cooling, and shall be heated at a minimum of 50 degrees Fahrenheit. The indoor facility shall be heated or cooled as necessary to keep temperatures within appropriate limits, based on the dog breeds kept at the facility and the ability of those breeds to acclimate to temperature variation. Dogs shall be protected from heat, cold and humidity that may be injurious to their health.
 - At the time of the inspection the weather was cold, wintery conditions with an air temperature of approximately 20°F. Five (5) dogs were being kept indoors within the pole shed building. The space was not heated and was found to have an air temperature of approximately 35-40° F. Due to the absence of dog shelters, this space was found to be inadequately heated to provide dogs with protection from the cold.

This deficiency was correctly shortly after the inspection with the installation of dog shelters within each indoor enclosure. The construction of these enclosures complied with provisions under ATCP 16.24.

Inspection result:

Based upon the findings from the pre-licensing inspection a FULL status license is recommended to be issued.

Discussion with Stokhaus Media, LLC:

- The minimum age requirement and certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) requirements were discussed. SM stated puppies are not sold before 7 weeks of age and that they examined by a veterinarian prior to sale. Benell explained the CVI requirement and that each customer is to get a copy of a CVI. Benell explained the Wisconsin Intra-state DS CVI.
- License renewal and inspection procedures were discussed.
- SM was made aware of the requirement to post the license and most recent inspection report in accordance with ATCP 16.12(5)(b) and ATCP 16.02(4)(a).
- SM was made aware of the requirement to post the license number on any advertisements in accordance with ATCP 16.02(5).
- Import requirements were discussed under ATCP 10.80(1).
- B. Canis was discussed and educational materials were provided.

Notes:

• Benell reviewed the record keeping requirements with SM and provided recommendations for maintaining such records. Primarily electronic records were being kept. Puppies recently sold were at least 7 weeks of age when sold. All indoor and outdoor facilities were observed to be in good condition and clean. All housing had adequate sanitation, lighting, ventilation, and air temperature. All dogs on premises were observed to be in good body condition, well groomed, and appeared to have adequate food, water, inanimate enrichment, and exercise on the date of the inspection.
